How full is your life? I mean, how busy, chaotic, noisy and activity-filled are your days? Do you have times of peace and quiet? Do you have one-on-one intimate moments when the God who created all things can touch your heart and whisper His love into your life?

Psalm 46:10 is a well-loved Psalm. "Be still and know that I am God." We have those still moments quietly watching the sunset over Lake Michigan. We have those still moments during quiet moments at a National Youth Gathering with 22,000 brothers and sisters in Christ. We have those still moments taking a break during our favorite hike when we are out of cell coverage. In those moments when our hearts are embraced and overwhelmed by God's closeness, we are changed. Those moments warm and sustain us, but they are so few. "Be still" - that is not easy in a fluid world where work flows into vacation time. "Be still" - that is not easy when we judge our value by how many likes a post gets, so we keep producing content. "Be still" - that is not easy when noise overwhelms us from the time we wake up to just before we fall asleep. However, when we have the still moments and know that the Lord is God, we are satisfied.

While you are reading this, I am on my sabbatical. Thank you, ILC, for this first-in-a-lifetime opportunity. I will have six weeks to be quiet before the Lord; six weeks to practice and study meditation; six weeks to be away from all the noise. Thank you for allowing me this opportunity.

So what will I be doing on my sabbatical? Some of my meditation moments will be:

- 1. Two days out in the woods by Newaygo. I will be alone with my Bible and books on meditation. I will unplug and quiet myself to prepare for the next few weeks.
- 2. Spending eight days at Manressa Catholic Retreat over by Detroit learning the Ignatian Contemplation way. This will be 23 hours a day of silence to dwell in the Gospel narratives—to see, feel and be with our Jesus, noting His touch and experiencing His love.

3. Traveling to Hong Kong to practice meditation at Tao Fong Retreat Center. This is a place where a Norwegian Lutheran Pastor carries on the work that started in mainland China before the Cultural Revolution to bring Christ to Buddhist monks. I will have the opportunity to practice their Christfulness techniques and talk with former Buddhists about their new way of being still.

Why am I doing this? First, I love being in God's presence. For me that often happens when I am quiet and focused on Him, not myself or my busyness. Second, the Old Testament is full of references of being alone with God and meditating on His Word. With the rise of screens and social media, our gifts can easily get out of balance. We can do so much with the gift of technology, but we have to be discerning about when it is mastering our lives. Jesus often went away by Himself to pray, meditate and be silent before His Father in heaven. I need that, too. I need it more than a travel blog fix or the latest Lions news. I need to meet the Creator of the places people travel to and the Lion of the tribe of Judah! I am doing this with the hope that I can help you experience God through peaceful rest in His Word. I hope to be a blessing with a sermon series on meditation and a weekly meditation retreat this fall.

During August and the first couple weeks of September, you may not be able to reach me (I will check my email when I can so I do not have 900 when I return). From Pastor Tyler Carter

Thank you for supporting our youth in sending them to the National Youth Gathering in Minneapolis, MN. The theme of the gathering was Real, Present, God based on Psalm 46. We all learned a lot, and I want to share some of the main points I brought home with me. I pray they convict and encourage you as well.

We have a God who is real in the midst of suffering and frees us to be real with each other about the struggles and joys we experience in life. It is so liberating when you can be real with someone else, when you let down the walls and fake smiles, and you don't simply reply with, "Life's good." Being real with people requires vulnerability which takes courage to expose who you really are. How cool it is to have a God who is real. Jesus felt and expressed emotions just like each of usfrom betrayal, to feeling alone, to experiencing the loss of a friend, to laughing with his disciples. God is real. How can you be real?

Being present with others is an art that we are all losing. Our attention for others is always competing with our entranced gaze at our cell phones. Keeping up with our social media feeds, the mind-numbing games, and the impossibility of catching up with our Netflix binging has taken over our time. Fortunately, we have a God who is present with us, a God who does not get distracted but dwells with each of us. He is in the middle of our deepest pains, with us in our secret sins and celebrating in our greatest joys. God is present. How can you be present?

God created the heavens and the earth. He formed man in His image and breathed into him the breath of life. God, the one who holds all authority, who condemns and punishes injustice and evil, who is love and pursues His people, who leaves the 99 in search of the one, this God made you! He loves you, pursues you, offers to be with you to the end of the age. How can you know God better?

We have a Real, Present God! Jesus invites us to be disciples, to worship, follow and obey our Real, Present God. We claim to be disciples who desire to follow God, but we often leave out being real and present. Sometimes we even leave out God. I encourage each of you to be disciples who make disciples. We offer many programs that you can experience and express God's love through, but I argue that programs are only a means within themselves. Discipleship doesn't happen through programs. However programs offer opportunities for relationships. It is through relationships that discipleship happens.

God is calling each of us to have mentors, people who are teaching us to walk in relationship with our Real, Present God. Who are the people in your life that point you to God, who ask the hard questions, who challenge you to pray and listen to what God is revealing to you? We are also called to be mentoring, teaching others to walk in relationship with our Real, Present God. We are not disciples if we are not discipling. We fail to do what Jesus has prepared us and called us to do—"Go and make disciples." If you do not have mentors or you are not mentoring, ask God to reveal who these people are. Jesus tells us that when we seek, we will find. I invite you to participate in Delta (starting September 16 at 7pm every Monday) as we take a deeper look at the importance of being disciples who make disciples. How can you be a disciple that makes disciples? \$\frac{1}{2}\$

UPDATE! - CONSTRUCTION ZONE

Thanks to your generosity in support of the Cornerstone Campaign, the shingle replacement for the Sanctuary roof is scheduled to begin the first week of September. The project is expected to last four to five weeks depending on the weather. The work will be done during weekdays starting on the west side of the church which will require that Division be closed to through traffic. Access to the south parking lot will still be available during the week. Division traffic en route to Michigan St. will be re-routed to Crescent. On weekends, Division will be open to through traffic and for parking. Upon completion of the west side of the roof (after approximately three weeks), the project will relocate to the east side. The lower level of the east parking lot **will not** be accessible during this time. As more information is made available to us. we will pass it along to you! Thank you for your patience as we work to maintain and preserve God's gift of our sanctuary.

From Jim Harger—Servanthood Leader

After several months on the job, I'm struck by all the ways our members have found to live out their faith and build up others in the name of Jesus.

During hard times, we pray for each other and give each other hugs. We bring meals, babysit children, give rides to the doctor, feed pets and mow lawns. We visit folks in their hospital rooms and pray with family members. We offer companionship and Holy Communion to our homebound members.

When God takes a member home, we mourn with the family at the funeral, pick up relatives at the airport and prepare funeral lunches. We send cards and flowers and honor the loved one with memorial gifts.

During good times, we celebrate baptisms, confirmations and graduations. Marriage announcements are celebrated, weddings are attended and baby showers are thrown.

On Sunday mornings, teams of volunteers greet guests and members, making sure they are safe and feel welcome. The talented musicians who inspire us spend hours in rehearsals ahead of time.

We gather to study the Bible in settings aimed at children and adults, new Christians and old. We organize into small groups to discuss and study how God's Word applies to our lives.

We fill food baskets at Thanksgiving and stock food pantries. On the last Saturday of every month, we welcome our neighbors for free pancakes and sausages. We offer our guests health screening and access to social services.

We send teams to spend time with foster kids at St. John's Home. We send teams to Russia to bless kids in orphanages.

Outside of our church walls, we have members who cuddle babies who need extra care due to their mother's drug dependencies. Members visit prisoners, tutor kids and travel abroad to support gospel ministries in other countries.

Each one of these activities require effort and take time we might not always want to give. We end up sharing in each other's pain and suffering. Tears are shed, sleep is lost and feelings are hurt.

But consider what Jesus did for us. Consider the price He paid on the cross. Consider the victory He won over Satan and death.





Our final Family Night for the summer will be on Wednesday, August 7. Family Nights are for parents and children of all ages. Nursery and VBS are for children birth—5th grade. High school-

aged kids are serving as student-leaders. Dinner and fellowship are included for all who attend from 6:00-8:30pm. ❖

"Then Peter came to Jesus and asked, 'Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother when he sins against me? Up to seven times?'

Jesus answered, 'I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times. Therefore, the kingdom of heaven is like a king who wanted to settle accounts with his servants. As he began the settlement, a man who owed him ten thousand talents (*millions of dollars*) was brought to him. Since he was not able to pay, the master ordered that he and his wife and his children and all that he had be sold to repay the debt. The servant fell on his knees before him. "Be patient with me," he begged, "and I will pay back everything." The servant's master took pity on him, canceled the debt and let him go.

But when that servant went out, he found one of his fellow servants who owed him a hundred denarii (a few dollars). He grabbed him and began to choke him. "Pay back what you owe me!" he demanded. His fellow servant fell to his knees and begged him, "Be patient with me, and I will pay you back." But he refused. Instead, he went off and had the man thrown into prison until he could pay the debt. When the other servants saw what had happened, they were greatly distressed and went and told their master everything that had happened.

Then the master called the servant in. "You wicked servant," he said, "I canceled all that debt of yours because you begged me to. Shouldn't you have had mercy on your fellow servant just as I had on you?" In anger his master turned him over to the jailers to be tortured, until he should pay back all he owed.
